2008 Queen Rearing Classes

In 2007 the Ohio State Beekeepers Association started the Ohio Queen Project to improve the quality of queens used by Ohio beekeepers and to reduce dependence on queens and bees from the southern states. In addition to identifying superior stock and breeding to improve the stock, the program was setup to teach beekeepers how to raise their own queens for themselves and others.

This is a hands on class. In addition to receiving class instruction, students will be participating in setting up the cell builder and grafting larvae. Please bring your veil and suit on Friday as we will be opening hives. A manual and all other supplies (grafting tools, frames, etc.) will be supplied for the class. Students will have the opportunity to graft larvae from instrumentally inseminated breeder queens and can pick up the finished cells for placement in their own mating nucs. Students may also leave their nucs at our yards to mate with our drone population.

Any beekeeper interested in queen rearing is encouraged to attend. You do not need to have a large number of hives to take this class or to raise a queen. Beekeepers with as few as 1 hive have taken this class in the past. Only a desire to learn about how queens are raised is required.
